

Accessibility Statement

The American Alternative Care Policy Network (“AACPN,” “we,” “us,” or “our”) is committed to making www.aacpn.org and its online information, membership features, and communications accessible to people with disabilities.

1. Our Commitment

AACPN seeks to provide an inclusive online experience and to improve access to its public information, membership resources, programs, and services. Accessibility is an ongoing responsibility, and AACPN welcomes feedback that helps identify and correct barriers.

2. Accessibility Goal

AACPN aims to improve the website in alignment with generally recognized accessibility practices, using the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.2 Level AA as a goal where reasonably practicable. This statement describes an ongoing effort and is not a certification that every page, document, feature, or third-party component currently satisfies every WCAG success criterion.

3. Measures We May Take

AACPN may use a combination of Wix accessibility tools, automated testing, manual review, user feedback, and content-design practices to improve accessibility. These efforts may include:

- Using meaningful page titles, headings, labels, and link text.
- Adding alternative text to informative images where appropriate.
- Supporting keyboard navigation and visible focus indicators where the website platform permits.
- Reviewing color contrast, text size, zoom behavior, and the use of color to communicate information.
- Providing captions, transcripts, or other alternatives for multimedia when reasonably available.
- Using accessible document formats or providing an alternative format upon reasonable request.
- Reviewing forms, checkout, account access, and member-only features for usability with assistive technology.

4. Third-Party Content and Platform Limitations

AACPN’s website is built and operated using Wix and may include third-party payment, authentication, analytics, social-media, video, event, webinar, mapping, advocacy, or embedded-content tools. AACPN

does not control every accessibility feature of these platforms and cannot guarantee the accessibility of third-party websites or services.

AACPN will nevertheless consider reasonable steps within its control, including providing information through an alternative method when a third-party feature presents an access barrier.

5. Requesting Assistance or an Alternative Format
